Schumann's big day helps Monarchs fly

It was the epitome of what makes the Bishop McGann-Mercy Monarchs girls track and field team so good.

There were so many good performances, so many good stories, in the Monarchs' 84-57 home win over The Stony Brook Bears on Tuesday afternoon. Olivia Schumann won three individual events for McGann-Mercy (5-0 overall and in Suffolk County League VII). She was first in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles (1 minute 13.7 seconds), the 200 (27.8), the high jump (4 feet 8 inches) and ran the final leg of the winning 4 x 100-meter relay team (53.9) that also included Sasa Vann, Kayleigh Macchirole and Karli Nunez.

"Olivia is so talented," McGann-Mercy Coach Tricia Nunez said. "She is dedicated and hardworking. She is a coach's dream."

Vann won the 100 in 13.1 and the long jump at 14-9 3/4. Karli Nunez was victorious in the triple jump at 30-6 and came in second in the 100-meter high hurdles in 18.7. Macchirole won

the 400 in 1:04.7.

In the long-distance races, McGann-Mercy's Emily Venesenina won the 1,500 in 5:38, and teammate Lauren Valle took first in the 3,000 in 12:54. McGann-Mercy freshman Lindsey Gelling captured the 1,500-meter racewalk in 8:45. Tricia Nunez called Gelling's performance "awesome."

The Monarchs also won the final two relay races. The 4 x 400 relay team of Tori Cataldo, Tori Creble, Venesenina and Ashly Yakabowski was clocked in 4:39. In the 4 x 800 relay, Celia Hague, Tiffany Holohan, Callie Gelling and Valle were timed in 11:48.2.

Cataldo, a freshman who Tricia Nunez said "is so versatile, she has the most potential on the team," also won the 800 in 2:38.

The loss dropped Stony Brook's record to 1-3, 1-3.

Tricia Nunez was pleased with her team's effort.

"This is an amazingly talented group of kids," she said. "They are hardworking. You couldn't ask for a nicer bunch of girls to work with."

In the top of the first inning, Lessard and Amy Boden scored on passed balls. Lessard then knocked in a run on a fielder's choice in the third inning to give the Monarchs a 4-0 lead.

McGann-Mercy kept adding to its lead and finally broke the game wide

open with eight runs in the seventh inning. Karlin McIntyre, Lessard, Boden, Amanda Burriesci, Kelly Crowley, Caitlyn Lawler, Kristin Bieber and Anna Crowley all had hits in the uprising.

Emma Betuel took the loss for the Ravens, who took their sixth loss in seven games.

The win propelled McGann-Mercy into third place with a 3-2 record.

"This is the best team we've had and it is continuing to grow," Paton said. "We've got a lot of youthful energy that is maturing. It is fun to watch this."

Paton said the game was "a confidence boost for Anna."

"Anna and Amanda [the catcher] are a tough duo and they have strong bats," Paton said. "Anna is still only a sophomore. She had 10 games of varsity experience as a freshman. She is our pitcher of the future."

With a present that isn't too bad.
